



Dear Members of the Rescue Fire Board,

We are writing to you today as representatives of the Rescue Professional Firefighters Association to express our concerns regarding the recent decision by the Cameron Park CSD to brown out Station 88 on Alhambra Drive. As you are aware, the closure of Station 88 will have a significant impact on the surrounding agencies, and we believe it is important to address the potential consequences of this decision.

As you may recall, in 1997, the Rescue Fire Protection District signed the Western Slope Cooperative Fire Services Mutual Aid Agreement. This agreement was entered into by ten agencies that recognized the mutual benefits of using a closest resource dispatching model for fire, rescue, or medical calls. Since its inception, the Rescue Fire Department has been a "good neighbor" and has served other communities with no expectation of getting reimbursed for vehicle wear and tear or personnel costs.

Unfortunately, we have seen other agencies down-staffing stations or ignoring their Fire Districts generally, which has resulted in a lower level of service provided to their residents. Despite this, the Rescue Fire Department has continued to serve these communities without any expectation of reimbursement. However, with the closure of Station 88, the burden on Rescue Fire Department will be significant. In 2022, the Rescue Fire Department responded to 136 calls in the 88's response area (North Cameron Park), while there were over 1500 calls in the 88 response area, most of which would be handled by Rescue with the closure of Station 88. Additionally, Rescue responded to 172 calls in 47, 48, and 27 response areas in which Diamond Springs or El Dorado County do not respond to, including code 2 (non-emergent calls). By closing Station 88 and making us take care of the emergencies their community pays for, we are probably looking at doubling our call volume.

We understand that citizens do not care what patch is on our shirt when there is a fire or medical emergency, and time is critical when it comes to saving lives. To simplify things as much as possible, when it comes to heart attacks, "time is muscle," or "time is brains" when it comes to strokes. Fires grow exponentially with each second that passes. By impacting our responses, Cameron Park's decision to

close Station 88 will affect the community of Rescue by potentially increasing response times in our District, increasing costs to our budget, and taking an unquantifiable toll on our mental health.

According to Article VII of the Western Slope Cooperative Fire Services Mutual Aid Agreement, it is stated that "This agreement shall not be interpreted to relieve either party from the necessity or obligation of furnishing adequate fire and rescue services within any part of its territorial or jurisdictional limits." Based on this provision, we are of the opinion that the failure to provide coverage for areas 47, 48, 27, 74, and 88, and requiring Rescue to handle emergencies for which their community pays, amounts to a violation of this article. As such, we respectfully request that the Board takes the necessary steps to safeguard our community. This may involve exploring options such as annexing these areas, implementing a paramedic assessment fee for medical calls we respond to, or terminating the Western Slope Cooperative Fire Services Mutual Aid Agreement altogether.

Mutual Aid is not a giveaway program. The first and foremost concern is the protection of the department's home community. If the community is vacated, the plan must provide for move-ups by that agency into unprotected areas. Mutual aid shouldn't be a crutch for departments with insufficient staff or inadequate equipment. Every department must strive to provide quality, first-level, day-to-day protection.

Attached is the resource response report for 2022. We appreciate your attention to this matter and look forward to working with you to find a solution that ensures the safety and well-being of all communities involved.
